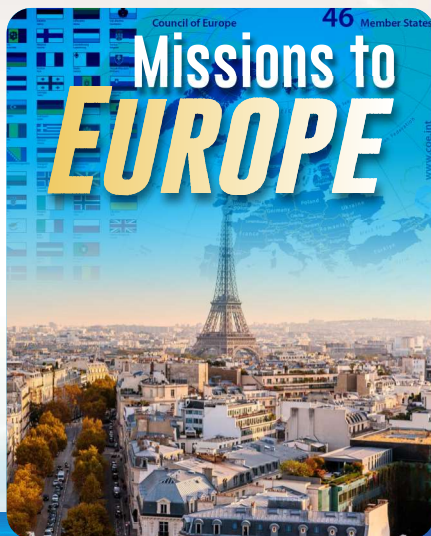
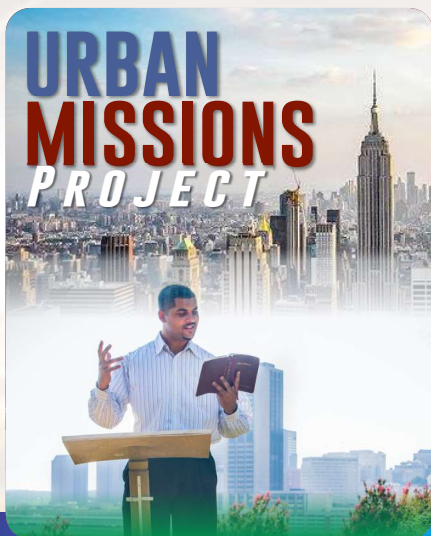
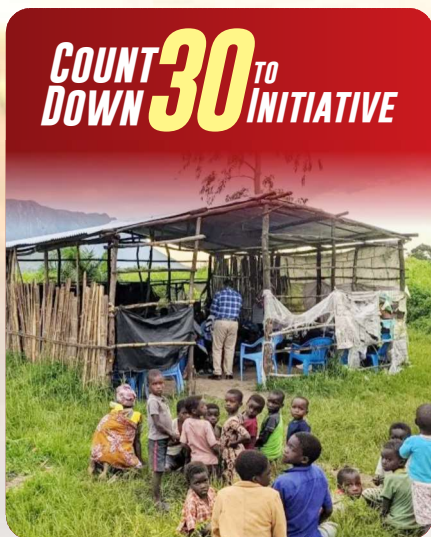

# **MONTH OF MISSIONS DEVOTIONAL**

**Saturday, February 1, 2025**

**Topic: The Lord will have wrought a great victory**

**Text: 2 Sam 23:11-12**

*“And after him was Shammah the son of Agee the Hararite. And the Philistines were gathered together into a troop, where was a piece of ground full of lentils: and the people fled from the Philistines. But he stood in the midst of the ground, and defended it, and slew the Philistines: and the LORD wrought a great victory,” (KJV).*

Men that are more than Conquerors must be bold even when they are abandoned. The man, Shammah, the son of Agee is a model worthy of emulation. He was described as a mighty man not because of his size and physical stature, but because he carried the heart of a lion (Prov. 28:1). Shammah was a devoted soldier who was on a mission to defend the territory of Isreal and a piece of land with a lentil. Other soldiers fled on sighting the enemies (Philistines), but he stood alone to stop the enemies from taking over the land. His boldness and determination were an invitation for God to intervene and take over the battle. Other members of the troop saw lentils and piece of land as nothing worth dying for, but Shammah saw beyond that. He saw it as a divine assignment of the King of kings and Lord of Lords that must be done. He spoke like Esther, Esther 4:16, *if I perish I perish*. It is noted that people who jeopardized their lives for the kingdom such as Daniel, Shedrach, Meshach and Abednego, David, Paul to mention but a few were not consumed by the evil.

The souls of men in Satan's train are worth dying for. They are part of the world that Jesus loves and died for. They are far more valued compared to lentils that Shammah defended. The piece of land he defended is far too

small compared to nations, tribes, and ethnic groups languishing in the hands of the devil. As we take risk to fulfill the Great Commission, the Lord Himself will grant us victory over our adversaries no matter their numbers. Let us be bold and stand the ground and take over for Jesus since the Lord Himself will wrought victory on our behalf.

**We should therefore pray:**

- For all frontier Missionaries and foot soldiers of the cross to be determined in order to confront the enemies. Victory is sure.
- For the divine presence of God with all missionaries and their families facing severe battles in the course of fulfilling this Great Commission to emerge and be more than conquerors.
- That the fear of the Lord come upon the enemy of the cross that they surrender and yield to His Lordship in worship and obedience.

**Sunday, February 2, 2025**

**Topic: The Royal Passion**  
**Text: 2 Samuel 23:13-17**

King Edward VIII was the Prince of Wales (1911-1936) and king of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of the British dominions and emperor of India from January 20 to December 10, 1936, when he abdicated the throne in order to marry Wallis Warfield Simpson of the United States. He was the only British sovereign to voluntarily resign the crown. Being a royalty comes with heavy and strict demands

especially the British Royal Dynasty. One of the demands was that the King, who is also by implication the head of the Church of England, must not marry a divorcee whose former husband is still alive. The singular action of King Edward VIII to violate this rule will not only cost him the throne of his father, but his entire descendants for all generations. His Brother Albert took over the throne as George VI, succeeded by His daughter Queen Elizabeth II who is succeeded by King Charles III her son. This to me is one of the most pathetic Royal stories in history, I can't imagine how his descendants will be feeling for the rest of eternity for this singular act.

In contrast to the above story is that of Attah Ameh Oboni of the Igala Kingdom of Kogi State, Nigeria. He went into history as the most celebrated and revered monarch of the kingdom besides his ancestor, King Ayegba Oma-Idoko, who sacrificed his only daughter, Princess Inikpi, to preserve the kingdom and the dynasty against the invasion of the Benin Kingdom between 1515 and 1516. According to the tradition of the Igala kingdom, the Attah is not only the king of the Igala nation but he is also the chief priest and spiritual head of Igala land. The Agaba Idu is second to none in the world and therefore, must not bow to anyone, shake the hand of a woman as a demand of his priesthood nor ever be seen to remove his cap in the public. All these three taboos were demanded of Attah Ameh Oboni in Kaduna at a meeting of all the kings and royal chiefs of Nigeria with Queen Elizabeth II which he refused. When King Ameh Oboni was forced to remove his cap by the soldiers on the instruction from "above", a swarm of bees invaded the conference hall causing every one including the Queen to run for their dear lives and bringing the meeting to a halt. His subsequent arrest and mysterious disappearance from the heavily guarded prison led to a conspiracy to dethrone him by the colonial rulers. When the dethronement became eminent, to avoid cutting off his descendants from the royal dynasty, he committed suicide and died as the supreme ruler paving way for his biological son Attah Micheal Ameh Oboni II who was the immediate past

monarch of Igala Nation.

In the Scripture for the day, 2 Samuel 23:13-17, David's 37 "mighty men" were mentioned. Three men were outstanding from the list. They jeopardised their own very lives, penetrated the garrison of the Philistines to bring water for the king of Israel, the anointed of God and the captain of the army of Israel. David didn't send them. He just made a loud wish and they responded with their lives to satisfy the desire of the king. They didn't come back to David with an excuse, they came with the water.

Now all the monarchs and Kingdoms of these world are just but a shadow of the kingdom of our God and of His Christ Jesus; into which you, the believer, was incorporated and adopted in Royal Priesthood. His ultimate passion and goal is that all nations, and kindred, and people, and tongues bring their worship to the Lamb and acknowledge Him as the Lord. What is your excuse?

### **Prayer:**

1. Lord lay a fresh burden of your passion for worship into my heart.
2. Raise a generation of priests and kings who are ready to die for the kingdom to bring in the harvest of worship from the nations.
3. Holy Spirit occupy the hearts of the youths of the Church with so much of kingdom matters that the world will not be able to distract them.
4. Give all the royal backing and authority in signs and wonders to all your faithful labourers on the mission fields among the unreached in and beyond Nigeria.

**Topic: More than Conquerors: Building and Thriving in Times of Troubles**

**Text: Daniel 9:20-25**

*“Then for sixty-two weeks it shall be built again with squares and moat, but in a troubled time.”*

Our text today refers to the divine visitation which Daniel had at a time he decided to seek the Lord's face. Jerusalem had been in ruins and had been desolate for close to seventy years. Jerusalem was in a sorry state with little or nothing to write home about it. However, just when the spirit of the people was at the lowest ebb, God sent His angel Gabriel with this reassurance: Jerusalem would be rebuilt again! After seventy years of ruins and desolation, hope was being rekindled. It is important to note the words of Angel Gabriel, “Then for sixty-two weeks it shall be built again with squares and moat, but in a troubled time” (Dan. 9:25b).

He said the walls of Jerusalem would be rebuilt during times of trouble or difficulties.

For those of us God has called into the missionary enterprise these words of Gabriel are very instructive. We are seeking to reach unreached tribes such as the Hausa and the Fulani in the Northwest of Nigeria or the Kanuri, the Buduma and the Shuwa Arabs in the North East. Beyond Nigeria, we have the Arabs and the Somalis amongst many others to

reach. God is saying that even though we are confronted with daunting challenges as we seek to reach these resistant tribes, that all said and done, these tribes shall be reached. We are faced with a struggling economy and yet God is sending us to nations within the Vision 5015 Plus scope like Iran and Iraq. We are being assured that despite the downturn in our economy, we shall be enabled to reach these countries and deploy Nigerian missionaries to reach them.

**Wednesday, February 5, 2025**

**Topic: Mission in the Face of Adversity:  
We Are More Than Conquerors**

**Text: Romans 8:37**

As followers of Christ, we are called to fulfill the Great Commission, sharing the Gospel with a lost and dying world. However, this mission is often fraught with adversity, challenges, and obstacles. In Nigeria for instance, there is insecurity occasioned by the activities of Boko Haram, Bandits, Fulani Militias, Lakurawas and Kidnappers. These are forces and more that we are grappling with in our bid to propagate and spread the gospel. In the face of such adversity or challenges, we must remember that we are more than conquerors through Christ Jesus.

### **The Nature of Adversity**

Adversity is an inherent part of life and mission. It can take many forms, including:

1. Persecution and opposition
2. Physical and emotional challenges
3. Financial and resource constraints
4. Cultural and language barriers

### **The Promise of Victory**

Despite the adversity we face, we have a promise of victory in Christ. As Romans 8:37 declares, we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. This means that:

1. We have the power to overcome adversity. This is because the one who mobilized us into His work has not backed out but continues to back us up in the assignment committed into our hands (Matthew 28:18-20).
2. We have the presence of Christ with us in adversity. The Lord Jesus has said, He will never leave us nor forsake us.
3. We have the promise of ultimate victory and triumph. Remember that we have victory always in Christ Jesus. The one who causes us to triumph always is the Lord Jesus Himself.

### **Action Steps**

1. Write down the adversity you are facing and the promise of victory that you can cling to.
2. Share your adversity and promise of victory with a fellow believer and ask for their support and encouragement.
3. Take a step of faith and perseverance in the face of adversity, trusting in God's sovereignty and goodness.

**Text: Romans 8:35-39**

In the early days, many young people, including two of my friends, suffered a boat mishap while pursuing frontier missions in a riverine area of Ondo state. Some died, and a few survived. Was this a tragedy or a loss? Years later, a young British-Nigerian returned to Nigeria as a missionary, despite the allure of a good education and prospects in England. He fell in love and married, and together they served in the Northeast of Nigeria. Tragically, his life was cut short by Boko Haram. Shouldn't this be counted as a loss?

How can we talk about victory amid such tragedy? The battle has always been fierce and bloody, with garments soaked in blood. Though the enemy has been relentless, our seeming losses are our ultimate gain. We are pre-awarded victory before we step into the battle arena.

Romans 8:35-39 reminds us that nothing in the universe has the power to diminish God's love towards us. Troubles, pressures, and problems are unable to come between us. Persecutions, deprivations, dangers, and death threats are impotent to hinder omnipotent love.

God's compelling love extended to us is unquenchable. This love has no space between us and Him, no matter the fangs of the fiendish Satan and his cohorts. Dead or alive, we win. Here or there, when all is said and done, we reign.

Our victory is not mere desire or a blunt death wish, but a resolve to see the Son of God get the full reward for the price He paid for all peoples around the globe. We will not lay down our arms until we bring every tribe, tongue, and language on bended knees before the throne.

Soldiering on, we take a nation at a time, one territory after another. We will triumph over everything, for God's demonstrated love is our glorious victory.

**Topic: An Unending Tasty**

**Text:** *But no matter what comes, we will always taste victory through Him who loved us. (Romans 8:37, The Voice)*

e visited Missionary M and his family serving in one of the troubled zones where insurgents continually carry out unprovoked attacks. They have had to escape from their abode on several occasion but soon return to continue to witness about the Saviour. We were very worried and concerned about their safety. We even tried to counsel them to consider leaving the place. But the response of Mrs M remains thought provoking. She said, "when we made up our mind to serve the Lord as missionaries, it's with utmost commitment. No matter what comes, we will be at our duty post. He is aware that we are here and so there is no need to bother about us." Does that sound like the opening expression of our anchor passage? "*But no matter what comes...*"

The Lord had us in mind when He spoke through Apostle Paul in Romans

8. Every of the circumstances mentioned in the passage: troubles, hardships, persecutions, hunger, poverty, danger or even death are situations that we currently face and will still face. It is rather reassuring that the Lord is aware of all of these even beforehand. The provision He made is even more compelling: *"we will always taste victory..."*. The audacity of the declaration is something to ponder on! The certainty and frequency of the victory is another to bank and bask on. This verdict is just the same assurance Jesus gave in John 16:33: *"...In the world you have tribulation and distress and suffering, but be courageous [be confident, be undaunted, be filled with joy]; I have overcome the world. [My conquest is accomplished, My victory abiding]"*. Now that is what you called two step authentication!

Mrs M apparently understands this provision and had exchanged every sense of anxiety for an unending anticipation to taste victory at every instance of turmoil. As we face the task unfinished and the complexities of reaching the nations, the woes and the miseries, the hate and the rejection, the closure and the despair; the paradox remains that, these all combine to produce a savour of victory. It's better tasted than missed. Chin up comrades and pilgrims! Behold meals of victory served in plates of anguish. The Master overcame and so we are more than conquerors! Hallelujah!!!

### Prayer

Thank the Lord for the provision and assurance of victory that we have in Him.

Pray that every believer and especially Gospel labourers will find hope in the victory that Christ has provided and be so persuaded to face the remaining task.

Receive strength, grace and renewed assurance for every kingdom

labourer that is currently down and about giving up. Ask that the Word of His grace will come to them afresh.

**Saturday, February 8, 2025**

**Topic: Until the Job is Done!**

**Text:** *Romans 15:19 in mighty signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God, so that from Jerusalem and round about to Illyricum I have fully preached the gospel of Christ (NKJV).*

As labourers in the field, we may sometimes feel justified in taking a break—thinking we've done enough and it's time to focus on other areas of our lives. After all, we're only human, and surely God would understand. However, Apostle Paul, in our opening text, sets forth a higher standard. With unwavering conviction, he declares, "I have fully preached." Similarly, in 2 Timothy 4:7 (NKJV), he reflects, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."

What is your progress report on your mission field or spiritual battleground? Have you fully covered the ground assigned to you, or have the challenges and obstacles led you to retreat prematurely? Are you celebrating victory too early?

When you enlist in the Great Commission, you cease to be a civilian. Just as a soldier on the battlefield does not turn back until the mission is accomplished, so must we, as God's ambassadors, persevere. Paul's testimony of perseverance is a powerful reminder: *Three times I was beaten with rods; once I was stoned; three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I have been in the deep; in journeys often, in perils of waters, in*



*perils of robbers, in perils by my own countrymen, in perils by the Gentiles, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; in weariness and toil, in sleeplessness often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness (2 Corinthians 11:25-27 NKJV).* Yet, none of these trials deterred him because he understood his mission and pressed on with the resolve of a good soldier.

Take a moment to evaluate your areas of influence, mission fields, and personal assignments. Are there aspects where you have not given your all? Reflect, re-strategise, and resolve to press forward. The Holy Spirit is ready to empower and equip you; you only need to invite Him in.

There remains much ground to cover, and all hands must be on deck. Romans 10:14 (NKJV) challenges us: "How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?" Let us rise to the task until the job is done.

**Text: Luke 12:15**

*"Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."*

In this dispensation, where the pursuit of material possessions often overshadows the value of spiritual richness, Jesus from this text encourages us to choose contentment over covetousness.

This verse, urges you and I to choose contentment over covetousness, as we discharge the spiritual mandate that was assigned to us. The text speaks directly to the heart of our relationship with material wealth and our attitudes towards possessions. It challenges us to reflect on the true source of fulfillment and happiness which can only be found in Christ Jesus, the author and the finisher of our faith. This text is steering us away from the empty pursuit of accumulating more material things.

The call to avoid jealousy and covetousness is not just a moral directive:

- It's a pathway to a more peaceful and fulfilling life.
- It's about recognizing our true worth.
- Happiness are not tied to what we own or what others have.

**Practical Prompts:**

**Cultivate a Grateful Heart:** Regularly count your blessings; name them one by one and express gratitude for what you have; no matter how little they are, others are praying to be like you. Gratitude shifts our focus from what we lack to the abundance we already possess.

**Find Fulfillment in Spiritual Riches:** Matt. 6:33

- Seek fulfillment in your relationship with God.

- Seek fulfillment in spiritual growth.
- True contentment comes from knowing God, not from material possessions.

### **Stop Comparisons:**

Resist the urge to compare your lifestyle, social status or possessions with others. One delicate thing that destroys a person is comparison, it can easily lead to discontent and will result in covetousness.

### **Live Generous Life:**

Generosity counters covetousness. Share what you have with others, and experience the joy that comes from giving rather than acquiring. Jesus word in **Matthew 10:42 should encourage us to be generous, you have something to give.**

### **Trust in God's Provision:**

Believe that God will provide for your needs. Trusting in His provision helps to alleviate the desire to covet what others have. Hear what God says in Phil.4:19. He is the one who can supply all your needs.

**Focus on Eternal Values:** Remember that life's true value is not measured by material accumulation but by spiritual and eternal treasures.

In Luke 12:15, Jesus calls you to a life of contentment, free from the endless and unfulfilling pursuit of more. Contentment over covetousness is about finding joy and satisfaction in what you have, who you are in Christ, and the countless blessings that come from a life lived in accordance with God's will.

Yet, the Word of God assures us that we are not merely survivors or victors but "more than conquerors" through Christ's unfailing love.

To be "more than conquerors" is to rise above the trials and turn them into testimonies of God's grace and power. It means that even in

persecution, lack, or rejection, we stand as living witnesses to the sufficiency of Christ. This assurance does not come from our strength but from the One who loved us and gave Himself for us. His victory on the cross secures our triumph in every endeavor, whether in preaching, teaching, giving, or interceding.

For field labourers, this truth brings encouragement amidst the reality of weariness and isolation. The challenges of adapting to new cultures, learning unfamiliar languages, and facing spiritual resistance can sometimes feel overwhelming. But remember, the One who calls also equips. In your weakness, His strength is made perfect. When you feel alone, He is the ever-present help. When the ground seems unyielding, He is the Lord of the harvest who makes all things fruitful in His time.

For the senders, the message is equally compelling. Your role in financing, praying, and encouraging missionaries is indispensable. Though you may not physically tread the mission fields, your obedience and sacrifice make you partners in the Gospel. Like the church in Philippi, who supported Paul in his mission, your generosity is a fragrant offering to God. Do not grow weary in doing good, for in due season, you will reap if you do not lose heart (Galatians 6:9).

But how do we walk in this reality of being more than conquerors?

**1. Anchor in God's Love:** Paul's declaration in Romans 8:37 rests on the foundation of God's unshakable love. Nothing—not hardship, persecution, or danger—can separate us from this love. When we are secure in this truth, we face trials with confidence, knowing that victory is assured.

**2. Abide in Prayer:** Prayer is the lifeline of every missionary and sender. It keeps us connected to God's will, empowers us for the task, and breaks down spiritual strongholds. Through prayer, we experience the

partnership of heaven in our earthly assignments.

**3. Focus on the Eternal Reward:** The sacrifices made in missions are not in vain. Every seed sown, whether in the form of labor, finances, or intercession, contributes to the eternal kingdom of God. Keep your eyes on the crown that awaits—the reward of hearing, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

**4. Encourage One Another:** The journey is easier when we lift each other up. As Paul wrote to the Thessalonians, "Encourage one another and build each other up" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). Whether through letters, visits, or simple acts of kindness, your encouragement can rekindle the fire in a weary soul.

Beloved, the call to missions is a call to conquer in Christ. Whether you are on the frontlines or supporting from behind, your labor in the Lord is not in vain. Stand firm, press on, and remember, through Him who loved us, we are more than conquerors.

**Topic: What is Separating Us Now?**

**Text: Romans 8:35-39**

In a world filled with uncertainties, pressures, pains, and trials, it's easy to question our security in faith and the unconditional nature of God's love. Paul's powerful proclamation in Romans 8:35-39 stands as a rock-solid affirmation: nothing can separate our connection to Christ's love. He

poses thought-provoking questions that reinforce our assurance. Regardless of whether we confront personal struggles, societal pressures, or spiritual battles, the undeniable truth is that His love remains steadfast.

Think about the various obstacles Paul mentions—trouble, hardship, persecution. While these can seem overwhelming, he reassures us that we are “more than conquerors.” This doesn't mean we will evade challenges; rather, it means that in Christ, we have the strength to endure and triumph over them. Our victories are not just about escaping difficulties and troubles but also about responding to them, grounded in the love of God. No problem can separate us from this truth.

Paul catalogs seven trials that threaten to separate us from Christ's love and dismisses them all. He experienced six of them. He died by the sword. The Roman Church faced all these troubles and more. Paul could not promise things would get better. He could assure them that nothing would separate them from the love of Christ.

### **Reflection**

Take a moment today to reflect on your current struggles. Are fears, kidnappings, hunger, or challenges leading you to doubt your worthiness of God's love? Bring these concerns before Him in prayer, asking for insight into verse 37: that you are not merely surviving but “more than a conqueror.” Let this powerful assurance sink in: regardless of what troubles you encounter, you are secured in God's love. Allow this truth to resonate deeply: no matter how low you fall or how high you rise; you remain enveloped in God's profound love. Consider sharing this message with someone facing similar struggles, reminding them that they, too, cannot be separated from the powerful love of Christ.

Do you think that the obvious gravity of suffering we are facing now nor the inward mayhem of distress, the relentless harm of persecution, the

complete deprivation of hunger, the severe exposure of nakedness? Nor the ongoing threat of danger and the corporeal peril of the sword can bring you down or separate you from the Love of Christ? No, they cannot.

### Prayer

Dear Lord, thank you for your immeasurable love for me. Help me remember that regardless of my challenges, your love is unwavering. Empower me to embody this truth and share it with others. Strengthen my spirit to be more than a conqueror in the face of adversity, always rooted in your goodness. Amen.

**Topic: No Retreat, No Surrender:  
Advancing as More Than Conquerors**

**Text:** *"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." – Romans 8:37 (NIV).*

The call to missions is both a privilege and a battle. For those on the frontlines of gospel ministry and those who support them as senders, the journey often involves trials, sacrifices, and spiritual warfare. Yet, Romans 8:37 reminds us of a profound truth: "In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us."

**Topic: A Gospel Worth Living and Dying For**

**Text: Romans 8:35-39.**

In the early hours of the morning of 22<sup>nd</sup> October last year (2024), I was pleasantly surprised and swept off my feet to receive the visit of one of the fathers of faith missions in Nigeria, Uncle Bayo Famonure, at my residence in Kuje, FCT, Nigeria. Uncle Bayo will be 77 years Old in June 2025. Below is a message from him to his brethren from his hospital bed in Jos University Teaching Hospital, JUTH when recovering from a deadly attack on him and his entire house hold by Fulani herdsmen on May 5<sup>th</sup>,

2020, that left him, his wife and son with bullet wounds. *The bullet though shot at very close range, didn't enter my skull. Then they shot at my leg, but it didn't break any bone. It could only be God. I feel so humbled that he took that much care of me. The bullet that entered my wife's back avoided the spine narrowly and stopped short touching vital organs by the whiskers. How can I thank the God who is like this? As I am writing, I am crying. I pledge my life to His service afresh! I believe this is a contemporary restatement of Apostle Paul's declaration in Romans 8: 35-39.*

Arch Bishop Benjamin Kwashi, also shared one of his experiences: *March 7-12 1987; one hundred churches were burned down in Zaria city. Over 300 Christian homes and businesses destroyed and several persons killed. I was the leader then of the Christian Association of Nigeria CAN, Zaria Chapter and the Lord asked me to tell the Church and Christian community to do nothing. I wrote that letter, it was circulated and the Christians watched the wanton destruction in large scale. In 2010, I was in Jos as Bishop about the same date, 7<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> March, three villages in the outskirts of Jos, Muslims massacred men, women and children. The church leaders were convinced to beg the villages and church leaders to do nothing. They cried until their voices dried up and there was no strength to cry, they just watched. In 2006, over forty people came to my house to kill me, it turned out that I postponed my return home and they met my wife, they did unspeakable things to her, beat her left her half dead and totally blind, through the mercy of God she recovered six months later in the US. Exactly one year later they came back, this time they met me at home, over 30 people came. They broke down the house. They broke the backdoor, came in and took me out to kill me. They later changed their minds and said they will kill me in my bedroom. I pleaded with them to pray, as I prostrated before the Lord, about 2 minutes later my wife was holding my hands and 5 minutes later my son came and I said what are you doing here and he said Daddy they have gone. What chased them away, what they saw, what they didn't see only eternity will reveal. Now friends, I am not saying this to downplay on those who have died. I have lost a classmate who was a pastor in Kaduna. He was roasted in*

*His church. I have lost colleagues, brothers and sisters who were slaughtered for their faith, Why I am alive I don't know, but one thing for sure I know, until my time is up and I know I will die one day, blood crash, air crash, car crash whatever crash, until that day, I have a gospel to proclaim, I have a gospel worth living for and I have a gospel worth dying for! Amen*

### **Prayer:**

Ask the Lord to grant you a renewed commitment to Him.

Pray that you may remain relevant in God's eternal purpose.

Bless the Lord for this year's month of missions. Receive His blessings on the labours done in prayers and in mobilising the Church and believers for the Great Commission.

**Topic: More than Conquerors**

**Text: Romans 8:37**

*"Yet amid all these things we are more than conquerors and gain a surpassing victory through Him Who loved us." (Amplified Version).*

### **Introduction**

**LOVE:** This word is the most powerful word there is. But it is also the most abused, misused, and misapplied ever! The children of God and the children of the devil talk about love. Every day, and everywhere, there is either a giving or receiving of love. The love in our text is unlike others. There are no two or three or more types of love. There is just "One Love" – others are but various shades of counterfeits and abuses masquerading

as love. God is love (cf. 1 John 4:8). True love is self giving, not self-seeking. Consequently, as children of our heavenly Father, we are **MORE THAN CONQUERORS** and gain surpassing victory **through Him Who loved us.**

### **Lessons for Reflection**

First, the triune love of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit was the basis upon which Paul could declare confidently that both himself, and “all who are in Rome, beloved of God, called to be saints” (cf. Romans 1:7), were **MORE THAN CONQUERORS**. In every generation, Jesus never promised His followers a cozy, comfortable life. Jesus stressed this truth, thus: *“I have told you these things, so that in me you may have [perfect] peace and confidence. In the world you have tribulation and trials and distress and frustration; but be of good cheer [take courage; be confident, certain, undaunted]! For I have overcome the world. [I have deprived it of power to harm you and have conquered it for you]”* (John 16:33, Amplified). Like Paul and the saints of old, we too must rest confidently on the fact that in spite of the turmoil and tribulations amidst us, the **LOVE** of the triune God over us is the foundation of our continuous declaration: **“WE ARE MORE THAN CONQUERORS!”**

Second, our pressing on against all odds in accomplishing the task and ministry the Lord has in mercy handed over to us, is not so that we will be loved of God, but because we are already loved by God. We are not striving to be more than conquerors so that God will love us eventually. **NO!** We are already loved and accepted in the Beloved. John writes, *“For whatever is born of God is victorious over the world; and this is the victory that conquers the world, even our faith”* (1 John 5:4, Amplified). We are more than conquerors **NOT** chiefly because we work to earn that ascription, but because we are born of God, Who loved us and gave Himself for us. If we are truly born of the Spirit (cf. John 3:6), then our entire make up (our 'DNA') is affectionately summed up by the One Who Himself has overcome the world as **“MORE THAN CONQUERORS!”**

Third, we must never allow the present difficulties, challenges, lack,

persecutions, rejection, opposition, famine, economic or financial crises, distresses, death or life, not even fear of the future, nor the pressures from within and without, have the final say. The God who controls the universe is fully aware of these things. This means that His expectation over us is to walk through them and emerge victoriously (rather than live in self denial of these situations). The God Who comforts us in all our troubles is **Immanuel**. The only echo; long, loud, and unceasing as the present battle rages is that spoken by Jesus, the Captain of our salvation: "YOU ARE MORE THAN CONQUEROR!"

### **Conclusion**

Dearly beloved, let us avoid all distractions and set our hearts to completing the ministry we have received in the Lord (cf. Colossians 4:16). John Piper notes, "A conqueror defeats his enemy, but one who is more than a conqueror subjugates his enemy. A conqueror nullifies the purpose of his enemy; one who is more than a conqueror makes the enemy serve his own purposes. A conqueror strikes down his foe; one who is more than a conqueror makes his foe his slave." The Church of Jesus Christ is marching on, subjugating the enemy of the Cross. Surely, the gates of Hades shall not prevail.

### **Prayers**

1. Pray that the Lord will increase our faith to trust Him more in the face of diverse oppositions.
2. Let us thank the Triune God for showering on us such a unique love that enables us to daily walk in victory.

**Topic: Sometimes Victory Does Not Feel Like Victory**

**Text: Romans 8:35-39**

After standing by a close friend's children so that the siblings did not subvert her will, I was publicly embarrassed at the funeral. I didn't react to them in anger but left quietly. A well-respected pastor who was part of the situation saluted my courage and admired my non-violent response. He told me, "You are truly a woman of God...!" Hmm! When I got back home earlier, I had wept before the Lord. I knew I had done the right thing by leaving the scene even though I was unjustly treated but deep down in me, I didn't feel good. That was when this expression came to me, "sometimes victory does not feel like victory."

Apostle Paul reminds us that nothing can separate us from the love of God. When Peter asked Jesus what would be their reward for leaving all to follow Him in Mark 10:28, Jesus' response included so many nice things but there was a caveat in verse 30 that the nice things would come with persecution. This is the part that is not often talked about in the Church but has become the reality of many Christians.

We expect our lives as Christians to be smooth, straight paths that do not include challenges. We do not expect suffering to be part of our walk with the Lord. We are unprepared for how to respond to difficult circumstances that surround our lives and ministry. Jesus told His disciples, "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world" (Jn 16:33).

The fact is that when we walk in obedience to the Lord, we leave the outcome to Him. That is the path of victory in Christ. When a missionary gets killed on the field in active service; a missions supporter's business is

attacked etc, we experience a deep sense of loss and sometimes confusion because we know we acted in obedience but the outcome was not what we expected. Paul encourages us to keep faith in the knowledge that nothing can separate us from the love of God. He directs us to a counter-cultural perspective, "We are more than conquerors through Christ" Rom 8:37. He reminds us of the finality and assurance of our victory despite the onslaught of the enemy against us. Our victory is based on the finished work of Christ.

This is our reality as believers and is not subject to how we feel. We are called to walk in obedience and live in the light of the reality of His word no matter how we feel. So even when victory does not feel like a victory, as we walk in obedience to the Lord, let us rejoice in the fact that we are more than conquerors, and overcomers in this life!

**Unwavering Love:** Paul boldly declares that nothing – absolutely nothing – can sever the bond between us and God's love. This isn't just about feeling loved; it's about an unbreakable connection rooted in Christ's sacrifice.

**Conquering through Love:** Even in the face of immense suffering, we are "more than conquerors." This isn't about brute force or human strength. It's about drawing strength from the love that sustains us.

**Ultimate Security:** The scope of this passage is breathtaking. It encompasses every conceivable threat, from physical dangers to spiritual attacks. God's love transcends all these, offering a profound sense of security.

### **Application**

Embrace the Love. Consciously dwell on the truth of God's unwavering love. Let it be your anchor in storms. Find strength in weakness. When facing trials, remember that God's strength is perfected in our weakness. Also share the Good News. This message of hope is meant to be shared. Let your life reflect the transforming power of God's love.

Lord God, thank you for your unwavering love. Help me to truly grasp its depth and experience its power in my life. Give me the courage to face any challenge, knowing that I am more than a conqueror through Christ. Amen.

**Topic: More than Conquerors**

**Text: Romans. 8:37-39**

From our text, it is clear that in our walk with Jesus and missions endeavours (as field missionaries, senders, missionaries in the market place) there will be overwhelming circumstances, challenges and situations that will daily confront us in different fields and terrains where we labour. Many may not voice it out because they have chosen a path to walk with the Lord and deliberately stay tune at every phase He introduces them too. Hence, these several issues that we are faced with are part of the package to test our love and faith in Christ and build us more into a relationship with Jesus ranging from financial lack, to stress and anxiety, persecutions, to afflictions and sicknesses, attacks (spiritual and physical), temptations and many more. Whereas, whether as senders and/or missionaries in any field, we are definitely going to encounters struggles, challenges, issues, confrontations. We must become resolute on a daily basis and make such affirmation like brother Paul that "in all these things we are not just an overcomer but more than conquerors." We must come into that place of covenant with the Lord just like Abraham said to the king of Sodom in Genesis 14:22, I have lifted up my hand unto the LORD, the Most High God, the possessor of heaven and earth, that irrespective of anything that comes our way we won't change from serving the Lord or believing him.

Listen, if in all these things we cannot ascertain our victory or triumph through Christ and the validity of His word, then there are tendencies that those things will separate us from the Love of Christ. However, we must labour daily into that place of knowledge to resist those things that have tendencies to affect our love for Christ and faith in the one that has called us out of darkness into His marvelous light.

Therefore, our new position in Christ is not that of struggling to overcome but a position of being more than conquerors. As we grow in love, faith and our walk with God, we will realise and manifest our true position of being more than conquerors. For God's intention for you and me is to know that we are more than conqueror. No matter what we face in our pilgrimage journey, Christ is with us, His love holds us, His goodness sustains us and His grace covers us to the very end. Hallelujah!

So don't give up, keep labouring in that mission field, keep sending the

supports, keep interceding for missions, keep encouraging missionaries, continue to be on mission with God even in your workplace and businesses. No matter the opposition and challenges, you are not just a conqueror, you are already more than conquerors.

**Topic: Why sit we here until we die?**

**Text:** *And there were four leprous men at the entering in of the gate: and they said to another, why sit we here until we die? 2 Kings 7:3*

Someone once said “the fear of death kills faster than death itself”. Long ago when I was in the secondary school, I heard the rumor of a General in the Nigerian Army who committed suicide because his second in command told him to do so. The news of the coup they both planned had leaked and they were both going to be executed. This was a deception by the second in command to enthrone himself. As soon as the General was confirmed dead, his second in command took control and overthrew the government, becoming the head of state instead of his boss. There are so many in the graves today that died running from the battle than those who died in the war.

The main reason there are few labourers in the kingdom harvest field today is not necessarily because there are few potential labourers, but that many able-bodied potential labourers are afraid of dying in the harvest field of the nations. Fear is the greatest obstacle to millions of labourers arriving on the right harvest fields and arriving on time. I have learnt a few lessons from the story of these four leprous men at the gate of Samaria that I will like to share in this short devotion:



1. God is always committed to performing His word through the obedience and labours of His servants who serves the Church in the purpose and in the interest of His kingdom and Glory.
2. God just needs selflessness and faith in a few men to fight the war that the nations are afraid of winning.
3. Whenever there is unity of purpose, faith is magnified in the right direction and God is committed to the miraculous.
4. God can win the nations by himself, but He always waits for the feet of men to announce His coming to the battle fields.
5. The victory of any denomination should be the breakthrough of the entire church, you may have fought the battle alone with God, but God wants you to share the harvest with all the brethren.
6. Esther said "if I perish I perish", these men were ready to die in pursuit of victory than to live a shameful life of agony and defeat.
7. The same death you are afraid to conquer at the gate, will soon come to take your territory from you at home, the earlier you rise, the better for you.
8. In Matthew 28:20 He said "and I will be with you till the end of the age." The greatest guarantee of God's victorious presence is on the harvest/battle field.

**Prayer:**

**Text:** *"And all the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had." Acts 4:32*

response to finishing the remaining task. Since iron sharpens iron, there must be something you're doing or have that the rest of the body can benefit from. There might also be something that someone else has that might be just what you need to do even better. We can only know this when we come together in fellowship. This is the basis of NEMA as the national networking association for the Nigerian Church and its missions movement towards fulfilling the mandate of the Great Commission.

Unity has power, and the weakness of the Church and the missions movement in advancing God's mission is our division. Paul wrote to the Corinthian Church to rebuke them about the personality cults among them, emphasizing that Christ is not divided. The target of Satan is the unity of the Church and the Missions Movement around the fulfillment of the Great Commission. We should not allow him. Every believer should avoid division which is one of the things God hates and as with the early church, renew our minds in the spirit of love and unity to bring speedy completion to this mandate.

The phrase "through Him who loved us" tells us that God's love for us has always been there for us. When believers meet opposition, they may feel alone or not good enough, but God's love is always there to hold them up. Romans 8:38–39 makes it clear that nothing can remove us from God's love in Christ, not even death, life, angels, demons, the present, the future, or powers.

Hold on to this truth: God's love surrounds me! when we feel rejected or scared. His love is what saved, called to the ministry, gives you the tools you need to do His work, and keeps you strong when things get hard. According to 2 Corinthians 11:23–27, Paul's life was full of pain, including beatings, disasters, jail time, and going hungry. But he thought these troubles were short-lived compared to the greatness that was to come (2 Corinthians 4:17). In the same way, our trials are not the end of the story. They are opportunities for God to display His power through your weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9).

In John 16:33, Jesus said, "In this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." As you walk into difficult situations, remember that Christ has already secured the ultimate victory. It doesn't matter how bad things look for you; you are part of His plan to win.

It's not enough to just get through hard times to be more than conquerors. You have to thrive in spite of them. With this way of thinking, you need to focus on Christ's success instead of your problems. Paul and Silas prayed and sang songs while they were in jail (Acts 16:25). Their happiness, which came from Christ, made them a strong witness, and the jailer and his family became Christians because of it.

Know this: your work does not go to waste (1 Corinthians 15:58). God sees every seed planted, every sacrifice made, and every tear shed. Jesus said that those who stay strong would get the gift of life (James 1:12). Focus on the happiness that will last forever in His presence.

Beloved, remember you are not fighting for victory but from victory. Christ's love secures your triumph over every trial, and His Spirit empowers you to fulfill His mission. Stand firm, knowing that nothing can thwart God's purposes through you. You are, indeed, more than a conqueror.

The Shepherds went on an errand that was delivered immediately. Verse 16-17, the Bible says: *They hurried to the village and found Mary and Joseph. And there was the Baby, lying in the manger. After seeing him, the shepherds told everyone what has happened and what the Angel has said to them about this child.* The shepherds in the field brought the news to the Priests, the Levites, the Doctors of the Law, the philosophers etc. Those who may question God and analyze His instructions before taking action lost the relevance to lay men on the field. The result was phenomenal, "All who heard the shepherds' story were astonished, but Mary kept all these things in her heart and thought about them often" (V. 18-19). The whole



world is waiting for the good news from your lips. They don't care which village or hamlet you came from, the school you attended or did not attend, one visit from the Lord and your sensitivity to his instruction can change your generation. Be sensitive to the signals to be both correct and current. You will not only be victorious but you will lead cities and nations to victory.

**Topic: Harvesting at God O'clock**

**Text: John 4:35-38**

Jesus was intense and intentional about the harvest. It was passion and core focus of His ministry. You cannot read the gospel carefully and miss His heart and burden for the harvest. To Him, nothing really matters at all if it does not matter to God and His glory among all peoples. In every encounter with both Jews and gentiles; in virtually all His miracles and through all His parables, the harvest was always in the front burner.

He came for the harvest. He lived and died for the harvest. He actually called harvesting His food, the sustenance, or the nourishment of His being. To ignore the harvest is to fail the litmus test of a true disciple. Harvest without a labourer is a tragedy. He establishes the Church, as His labour force, for the harvest. To misunderstand or misinterpret the harvest and its season is disastrous! He once stunned on His followers in today's text (John 4:35-38).

This jolted their fixed minds. A striking and consequential disruption of their calculation of times and seasons. Shifting attention from the

burden in verse 34 to the timing and consequence of our harvest involvement. A heart for the harvest will help us gain some understanding of thrust in this passage:

- Jesus says, it is God o'clock! It is harvesting time. Take another look at what time and season you are in. It is time to bring in the sheaves. Don't suspend your fruitfulness. If you read God's time piece, harvest is right now upon us.
- Don't postpone the harvest. Understand God's seasons. Appropriate God's season of the harvest and enter into the harvest. Don't delay the celebration. Throne room will soon be filled with people from all tongues, language, peoples and nations.
- Sowing is ongoing, so is the harvest. The reapers and the planters are on duty together. You can't be in and be left out, except by your own choosing. It is God O'clock. The harvest season is spaced to allowing fresh sowing, same time.
- At God O'clock the harvesters are being paid. If you enter into their harvest, you get something eternal for your labour. There is a lot more to harvest than your limited struggling efforts could grasp. The generation of starters are re-released into the generation of the finishers.

When your seasons and their harvests are God-timed, you're harvesting at God o'clock! When you sow in the God's a plot, you reap at God o'clock. In God's calendar, every season has a harvest, and every harvest has its own season!

### Prayers

May our time piece be set to synchronize with God O'clock. May the Lord connect our hearts with His timing for our seasons of the harvest.

May we not miss this revival birthing season of harvest of the nations in the horizon.

May read His piece in ways that help us stop postponing, delaying and denying the harvest.
